Toter service provides a clean, attractive container for storage of waste. Toters are completely enclosed with an attached lid to prevent odor problems and keep unwanted pests out of your trash. Toters are available in 60 and 90 gallon sizes, and eliminate the need to purchase garbage cans or plastic garbage bags. A 60 gallon toter holds about 2 bags or cans of waste and a 90 gallon toter holds about three bags or cans of waste.








Chief Schira Receives State Honors





VEHICLE STICKERS

All vehicles owned by a Bloomingdale resident or registered to a Bloomingdale address must have a Village vehicle license. Vehicle stickers go on sale March 1 and must be affixed by midnight, April 30, 1994.

The cost of the vehicle sticker for a passenger car has been raised from \$7.50 to \$10. Other vehicle license fees have also gone up accordingly. A penalty of \$5 will be assessed for late sticker purchases. This is the first time these fees have increased in nearly 20 years.

In addition to the Village Hall, vehicle stickers may be purchased at First Chicago Bank of Bloomingdale, Springbrook Facility and at the Springbrook Currency Exchange.







DIAL INTO THE LIBRARY'S CATALOG FROM YOUR HOME COMPUTER

Now you can dial into the library's computerized card catalog or as its more formally called, the online public access catalog (OPAC). You can call from your home, business, or school. Try dialing in to see if the library owns the title you are looking for and if it is available for loan.

Any microcomputer with a Hayes-compatible modem and communication software can call the library's online catalog. To dial in, your communication software should be set to the following protocols. Data bits = 8, Parity = None, XON/XOFF, Stop bits = 1, Duplex = Full, Baud Rates = 300, 1200, 2400. The telephone number to dial is 708-377-7396. Once you CONNECT press the return key. When the USERNAME prompt appears on the screen type: BLOOMINGDALE. After that just follow the directions on the screen. For HELP type? at any prompt. When you are finished, disconnect or shut off your modem. The library catalog has no logoff procedures.

DISTRICT 13 NEWS

Now that Erickson School has been completed and all of the boundary lines have been drawn, Bloomingdale School District has made all the changes it needs to make, correct? As you would expect, that is not what is happening. School district personnel can never "rest on their laurels."

The Board of Education uses district goals to manage change in the three schools of District 13. These goals written by the board and district administrators in an annual goal setting workshop give direction to the school employees and provide for reporting progress to the Board of Education. The eight goals currently being addressed are as follows:

- We will develop a school improvement program which is consistent with the Illinois School Recognition System.
- 2. We will provide an effective staff development program.
- We will negotiate an agreement with the district's teachers which is fair and appropriate for all.
- We will generate more participation and interest in the school community.

- 5. We will continue to develop special education inclusion programs as appropriate.
- We will develop a new report card for the elementary schools.
- 7. We will strengthen the district's gifted program.
- We will investigate ways to improve morale in the total school community, including staff, parents and students.

As you can see from these statements, a major emphasis of the district is to involve the community in the school district's programs. Parents and other community members are working on committees refining the community relations program, changing the elementary school report card, developing a new curriculum for reading and language arts, and taking our views about state laws to our legislators.

The second area of emphasis is curriculum improvement. We are evaluating all areas of the curriculum in the school improvement process, as well as focusing on special education and gifted education.

None of these goals are going to be achieved within one school year. All of them will take a great deal of effort by employees, board members and members of the community. If you have any questions about these goals or would like to volunteer to help, please give me a call at 893-9590.
