



World Cup Soccer Comes To Bloomingdale



This summer the Chicago metropolitan area will experience the excitement of World Cup Soccer. Similar to the Summer Olympics in magnitude, the World Cup Soccer Competition is the most-watched sporting event in the world. Taking place once every four years, this world championship soccer event dates back to 1930, but this is the first time it has ever been played in the United States.

Something of this magnitude has not taken place in the Chicagoland area since the Columbian Exposition which took place in the 1890's. Blooming-dale will be feeling some of this excitement firsthand as the Spanish team will be staying at Indian Lakes Resort for the better part of a month, early June to early July. It is an honor to

have been chosen as the host community for one of the international teams.

The Village is putting up banners and flags up along major thoroughfares in honor of the event. Indian Lakes is putting temporary flag poles up along Schick Road with the Spanish and American flags alternating. They are also doing their landscaping flowers in the Spanish flag colors of red and yellow. (The flag is actually three bars: red, yellow, red.)

Planting flowers in these colors is one way residents and local businesses might want to take part. Platt Hill of Platt Hill Nursery on Lake Street has done some research on the flower combinations that would accomplish this. Two combinations would be appropriate - yellow pansies with red snapdragons (to be planted late in April or early in May), or red geraniums with yellow marigolds (to be planted somewhere around May 15-20 barring a late frost)

Platt encourages people to shop the market for the flowers. Although he can provide them, he is concerned about his supplier not being able to



keep up with an excessive demand. However, he is willing to assist whenever possible.

The Business Promotion and Cultural Development Committee is currently working on tying in some activities with the Park District, Library, the hockey teams, the schools, if possible, and the community in general. The committee is hoping to create some other village-wide events to help generate publicity for the Village. Any business interested in sponsoring an activity should contact Trustee Reyes Ball at the Village.

1994 HYDRANT FLUSHING

It's that time of year again. Starting Tuesday, April 12th through May 5th, the Village Services-Utilities Division will be flushing hydrants throughout the Village. The flushing will occur between the hours of 8 PM and 12 midnight. Please **DO NOT WASH LAUNDRY** during the flushing hours, as rust staining of the clothing may result. Residents with water softeners are encouraged to check the cycle time of their softeners so that the unit does not regenerate during this period.

One question that is always asked is - "Why does the Village flush hydrants?" Hydrant flushing is routine maintenance for a water system. It accomplishes the following:

- Improves water quality: Flushing removes minerals such as iron and magnesium that have collected in the water mains.
- Improves water flow: By removing these minerals, the inside diameter of a water main is increased and therefore, allows a better flow of water.
- Hydrant maintenance: A fire hydrant is a mechanical device. Operation of a hydrant lubricates internal mechanisms and gaskets.
- Hydrant inspection: Any deficiencies are noted and repaired as necessary to insure that each hydrant will perform when needed for an emergency.

TRAFFIC SIGNAL CONSTRUCTION

Work is commencing on the construction of a traffic signal at the intersection of Schick Road and Country Club Drive. The project include fully actuated traffic and pedestrian signals, and left turn lanes on Schick Road. Vehicle sensors will be located in the pavement and pedestrian push buttons mounted on posts to help facilitate the flow of traffic.

During construction of this project, it will be necessary to close lanes on Schick Road. One lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained at all times of construction. It will be necessary to widen the pavement about 5 1/2 feet on both the north and south sides of Schick Road to accommodate the left turn lanes.


As with any project of the nature, there will be periods of delays in traffic due to construction. If possible, please use alternate routes, such as Lake Street or Army Trail Road.

This project should be under construction in April 1994 and will take approximately three months to complete.

A grant for 50% of the construction costs for this work has been obtained through the Intermodel Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA) to help defray project expenses. Indian Lakes Resort has agreed to contribute funds to offset a portion of the remaining Village construction and engineering fees.

Upon activation of the signal, an improvement in local access to and from Schick Road between Springfield Road and Bloomingdale Road may be realized. More breaks in traffic flow on Schick Road will help the side road access and egress due to traffic "platooning". The new pedestrian signals at the intersection and increased breaks in traffic flow will permit easier pedestrian street crossings along Schick Road.

BRUSH COLLECTION — CHIPPER PROGRAM

The Bloomingdale Public Works, Street Division, will be offering their annual Brush Collection and Chipper Program. This program will begin on Monday, April 25, 1994 through Friday, May 27, 1994.

The following information will help the residents of Bloomingdale to get prepared for this event:

- Brush, branches, and stems under six (6) inches in diameter are the only items that will be picked up. LEAVES, VINES AND MULTIFLORA ROSE BUSHES WITH THORNS, AND SMALL WILLOW STEMS UNDER 1/2 INCH IN DIAMETER WILL NOT BE PICKED UP.
- Each resident will be allowed pick-up ONLY during their scheduled pick-up week. Each brush removal period will be one week in duration.
- Residents are encouraged to have their materials out NO LATER THAN THE FIRST DAY OF THEIR PICK-UP SCHEDULE.
- ALL BRUSH, BRANCHES AND STEMS SHOULD BE PLACED AT THE CURB AND SHOULD BE STACKED IN AN_ORDERLY FASHION WITH CUT OR BUTT END TOWARDS THE CURB. Brush, branches or stems should not be bundled or tied. Any branches, stems, and brush exceeding six (6) inches in diameter will not be picked up.
- ALL BAG OR CANNED BRANCHES WILL NOT BE PICKED UP, SMALL TWIGS AND LEAVES SHOULD BE IN BAGS WITH TAGS FOR B.F.I. TO PICK-UP.

BETTER HEARING AND SPEECH MONTH LECTURE



Writers who wish to read their original works at this presentation are urged to contact Wade Nye at 529-5643 prior to April 7.





Lucy Mettewie has been a volunteer for one year. Her knowledge of WordPerfect and Lotus has helped many staff members with reports and bibliographies.


Niru Kapadia is the library's newest volunteer. The Youth Services Staff have learned to depend on her for preparing materials for story hours as well as weeding the special collections.


Together these loyal ladies volunteer over 1,500 hours of their time each year. The library board and staff thank them for their help and dedication.


