






Letter Carriers Collecting Food Donations On Saturday, May 10

highlights from our Ordinance No. 90-30:

The summer season is around the corner. Sprinkling restrictions are in effect from May 1 through September. These restrictions have been mandated by state and federal 🕍 authorities controlling Lake Michigan water allocations. The following are



The following restrictions apply to automatic sprinkling devices and allow for sprinkling only between the hours of 5:00 AM and 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM and 9:00 PM. These times have been established not only as a conservation method, but also as optimum times for effective lawn sprinkling with minimum loss due to evaporation or runoff.

Single Family residences with odd numbered addresses may sprinkle Monday, Wednesday and Saturday.

Single family residences with even numbered addresses may sprinkle Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday.

Units of government, commercial, industrial, manufacturing, office buildings and multi-family residential buildings may sprinkle on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday.

There is no sprinkling allowed on Fridays.

Permits for newly sodded or seeded lawns will be available from the Director of Village Services office upon application of such permit. Permits would allow for outside watering by means of automatic sprinklers for a period of thirty (30) consecutive days.

The use of hand-held water devices is permitted without restriction for any purpose except when the device is left on unattended, or no device is used to control the flow of water. If a hand-held watering device is left on unattended, it is subject to restrictions for an automatic sprinkling device.

Yard Waste Season is Underway

Browning Ferris picks up yard waste (grass clippings, leaves, brush trimmings and tree trimmings) from April 1 through November 30. Yard waste is to be placed curbside in either 33 gallon or less containers or in biodegradable paper bags. Yard waste stickers must be applied regardless of the method used.

Yard waste stickers are \$1.23 each and are available at the Village Hall or at the following local businesses: Dominick's, Jewel/Osco, Economart, and Bloomingdale Pharmacy. They may also be purchased directly from BFI. Remember, a yard waste sticker must be applied to each container or bag used.


BFI will also pick up bundled branches if a yard waste sticker is affixed to each bundle. Bundles should be no longer than four (4) feet and weigh less than 50 pounds. Branches may not exceed three (3) inches in diameter.



Bloomingdale Golf Course is Open for Business!

It has been an exciting year for the Village of Bloomingdale. It was only last March that Village residents went to the polls and overwhelmingly voted to make Bloomingdale a home rule community. The move enabled the Village to institute a 1/4 cent sales tax earmarked for the purchase of the 159-acre Glendale Golf Club.

In September of 1996 the Village officially purchased the property, ensuring the land would be preserved as open space. Since that time the Almanac has provided updates to keep the residents abreast of the intentions and changes in store for the golf course.

The Bloomingdale Golf Club, as it was renamed in a contest open to residents, has officially begun its first season. The weather did not dampen the enthusiasm of Mayor Bob Iden, Village Administrator Dan Wennerholm as they "sliced" the ribbon for the official opening day of Bloomingdale Golf Club on Friday, March 28.

The Village of Bloomingdale has contracted with Golf Plus for the management of the golf course operation. Don Helmig, owner of GolfPlus, is managing the golf course for us. He is not new to the golf club. Helmig has been here for 21 years. He began in 1976 handling the food and beverage for Glendale Golf Club. In 1989 he was asked to take over management of the golf course, in addition to the food and beverage.

In 1987, Hamilton Partners took over the property. Don says although it was a good relationship with them, the future of the course was always up in the air.

Hamilton's intent was to sell the land for development of a business park and there were times the sale was "only a month away." Consequently, there were no banquets booked from September 1995 until the Village purchased the property in September 1996. Don lives with his wife Joyce in Hampshire. They have four children and five grandchildren, none of whom golf, according to Don.

Don looks forward to working with the Village and is excited about rebuilding the credibility of the course and its facilities, as well as looking forward to the many improvements currently in the works for the course.

Cyrille Girouard took over operation of Catering Enterprises in 1989 when Don began managing the golf course operation. Α native Streamwood, he and his wife Amy now live in Hanover Park. You might say food service business is in Cyrille's blood as he grew up helping out at Pizza Cottage, his parents' restaurant in Roselle. He credits his food service education to those experiences, along with what he

learned cooking with the neighboring German chef. While at Pizza Cottage, Cyrille was involved in the community and active in the Roselle Chamber.

Ready to venture on his own, the young man opened P.C. East, a restaurant and off-premise catering business in Itasca in 1983. There he discovered he really enjoyed the catering and banquet end of the business. Don's offer to run the food service at the golf club came at exactly the right time for Cyrille.

Food for the events at the golf course is prepared on site in the full service kitchen as overseen by Cyrille. The well-known, extremely well-attended Lenten fish fry is one of those special events we may be able to see more of. Coming up on Sunday, May 11 is a Mother's Day brunch. Andy Carr is the most recent employee to come on board to Bloomingdale Golf Club. He is a PGA Golf Professional who was hired in February. Andy got his introduction to the game of golf growing up in California. He began his golf career "picking up the ranges" as a youngster. Following college, Andy moved to the Midwest.

The 35-year old has been the pro at Twin Orchard Country Club in Long Grove and at Hilldale Golf Course in Hoffman Estates. He currently lives with his wife, Laura and children, Joshua and Jessica in Streamwood.

As golf pro, Andy will manage the golf operations. This includes supervising staff, merchandising the Pro Shop, giving lessons and giving free golf clinics.

Brett Collins has been the superintendent of grounds-keeping since April 1996. Brett's job is year-round as he is in charge of maintenance of the grounds, greens, trees etc. He oversees the groundskeeping budget. His crew currently consists of a crew of nine groundskeepers, plus a mechanic.

Like Andy, Brett has nearly grown up around golf courses. He began 14 years ago working as a crew member for a groundskeeper and eventually worked his way up. His early experience was in southern suburbs of Flossmor and Calumet City. Most recently, Brett served as assistant to Tom Lively for eight years at Ruth Lake Country Club in Hinsdale.

Thirty-one-year old Brett, his wife Marian and son, 19-month A.J., currently live in the house at the south end of the golf course which keeps him very close to both work and home at all times.

Improvements, Facilities

There are several changes and improvements either completed or underway to improve both the look and the enjoyment of playing the course. New equipment has been purchased for the grounds crew which will better manicure the grass. Stumps and dead trees have been removed. Shrubs and flowers will be planted about May 15. The existing irrigation system will be in use and the intention is to extend the lines to many of the fairways. (continued on next page)

About the Golf Course . . .

All ball washers, benches, tee markers and trash baskets have been replaced. There will be a computerized handicap system. Several of the holes will be changed for more interesting play, although this will not interfere with the play during this season. The course will remain open during the construction period. Lohmann Golf Design is the golf course architect re-designing the holes.

At this time there are still permanent tee times avail able, as well as openings for golf outings. There are three banquet rooms available at Bloomingdale Golf Club for special events. The Antler Room holds 175 comfortably; the Surrey Room will accommodate 100 and there is a smaller room for 50 people. The banquet facility will be available now through October 1998, at which time the building will be demolished in anticipation of the opening of the new clubhouse.

The Village recently contracted with Larson-Kramer-Kjelstrom and Associates, Ltd. to design and build a new clubhouse. Construction is slated to begin in November, 1997. The new clubhouse will be located at the present Pro Shop location. It will be two levels for a total of approximately 18,000 square feet. It will include a Pro Shop, golfer's bar, plenty of lockers for both men and women, as well as a banquet room that can accommodate up to 240. The new facility is planned for a March 1999 opening.



When Marklund began in 1965, the building was designed for developmentally disabled clients from infancy to age six. Today, 41 of the 98 clients are over the age of 18. Because of difficulty in lifting these older clients in and out of the bathtub, Marklund approached the Knights of Columbus St. Isidore's Council for help.

Once again the St. Isidore Council was happy to assist. They purchased a \$10,000 Parker Madison Model 442, no ordinary bathtub. This equipment allows the client to be placed on a table and the tub containing up to 65 gallons of water is elevated to cover the bather.

The St. Isidore Knights have a long history of helping Marklund with funds from their annual Tootsie Roll drives. BLOOMINGDALE RECEIVES TREE CITY USA GROWTH AWARD



Bloomingdale has been named a Tree City USA by The National Arbor Day Foundation. It is the second year Bloomingdale has received this national recognition.

Bloomingdale is also the recipient of a Tree City USA Growth Award for demonstrating progress in its community forestry program in the following activity areas:

- ◆ Engineering/Forestry Coordination
- ◆ Land-Use Planning Coordination

The Growth Award was created to recognize environmental improvement and higher levels of tree care in Tree City USA communities.

A National Arbor Day Foundation program, Tree City USA, recognizes U.S. towns and cities which develop comprehensive urban forestry programs.

Tree City USA began as a 1976 Bicentennial project co-sponsored by the National Association of State Foresters and the USDA-Forest Service. The National League of Cities and the U.S. Conference of Mayors are now co-sponsors as well.

To become a Tree City USA, a community must meet four standards: a tree board or department, a tree care ordinance, a comprehensive community forestry program, and an Arbor Day observance. Communities apply for Tree City USA annually.

"As we celebrate the 125th anniversary of Arbor Day this year, it is especially appropriate to recognize the value of trees to our communities," John Rosenow, The National Arbor Day Foundation's president said. "Trees beautify and lend value to our homes, neighborhoods, parks and business areas. At the same time, those trees conserve energy, help clean the air, protect rivers and streams, and provide a home for wildlife."

"An effective community forestry program is an ongoing process of growth and renewal — a program of planting and care that continues through the years," Rosenow said. "The Tree City USA award is an excellent indication that there is a solid foundation for that process of improvement."

On March 18, 1997, Bloomingdale received the awards at the Illinois Department of National Resources Tree City USA Conference and Awards Ceremony held at the Morton Arboretum, Lisle, Illinois.

Introducing -A New Self-Checkout System


On April 14 the Bloomingdale Public Library will introduce the latest in library technology which allows patrons to check out books on their own.

The 3M SelfCheck System, which works like a bank's ATM, increases efficiency and service by allowing staff to use their skills where they are most useful -- assisting patrons with research, planning community programs and fulfilling requests -- rather than routine material handling. This system also increases security and helps prevent materials loss because it links the already existing automatic circulation system with the 3M Security System, which electronically tracks materials.

The 3M Self Checkout unit is fast and easy to use, and guarantees your privacy. The color monitor guides patrons through each step of the transaction with onscreen prompts and graphics that fully explain the process to even first-timers without assistance from staff.

Here's how it works: Patrons place a library card into the unit, which accesses the individual's database. If the patron is an approved customer, he/she may place the first item to be checked out into the unit. The system's internal scanner then "reads" the item's bar code and records the transaction while electronically "deprogramming" the item so that the patron may take it through the security gate at the library's exit. After all items are checked out by the system, it prints a date-due slip to complete the transaction.




